

Batch Background Removal Cheat Sheet

Step-by-step workflow to process 100+ product images per hour — naming, formats, QA checks.

The 5-Phase Batch Workflow

Phase 1: Prep (5 min)

- Sort originals into folders by category (electronics / apparel / home)
- Use consistent naming: SKU_color_angle.jpg (e.g. ABC123_black_front.jpg)
- Set the camera to the same resolution (3000×3000 px recommended)
- Clean lens and use the same lighting setup for new photo sessions

Phase 2: Upload (5 min)

- Drop the entire folder onto your batch background remover
- Choose output format: PNG for layered work, JPG for final listing
- Set output naming: SKUs preserved, suffix: _nobg.png
- Trigger processing and walk away — most tools queue in background

Phase 3: QA Pass (15 min)

- Open a random 10% sample of outputs
- Check: white pixels around edges (fringing), missing subject portions
- Check: dominant colors match the original product
- Re-run any failures individually (most batch tools support per-item retry)

Phase 4: Export (10 min)

- Resize for each platform: Amazon 2000×2000, Shopify 2048×2048
- Convert PNG → JPG with 90% quality for final marketplace upload
- Strip metadata (EXIF) to reduce file size
- Generate folder of platform-ready assets by category

Phase 5: Verify (10 min)

- Upload 5 random images per platform and check rendering
- Verify aspect ratios match platform guidelines
- Check file sizes are under platform limits (most cap at 10 MB per image)
- Spot-check colors match across browsers (color profiles vary)

Common Batch Mistakes & Fixes

Uploading huge raw files

Fix: RAW files are 25–50 MB. Convert to JPG before batch upload.

Forgetting to sort by category

Fix: Mixed categories need different export resolutions — sort first.

Accepting default output naming

Fix: Mismatched filenames break marketplace upload scripts.

Skipping QA on edge cases

Fix: Glass, mirrors, and metallic objects often fail — re-process individually.

Compressing too aggressively

Fix: JPG below 80% quality introduces visible artifacts on white backgrounds.
